Dear Parents and Carers,

Over the past week I have attended the Harvest Festivals for each of our schools. There has been some fantastic poetry read out, some fabulous singing and sharing of art work. It is always lovely to see them perform in front of an audience, and to see their confidence grow over time. I was very proud of them all.

I hope you were all able to meet with your child's class teacher last week, and had the opportunity to review the progress they have made, and to celebrate the good work they have done. I know the teachers have found these meetings really valuable, especially where they have moved class, and I hope you found it beneficial too. One of the areas for us to develop which came out of the recent parent surveys was about providing further information about your child is doing and so as we reach the end of this term we will be sending out a behaviour and attitude report; this will focus on the attitudes and behaviours children display and towards others children and adults around school.

General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR): As a Trust we take our responsibilities under GDPR very seriously to ensure we meet and comply with the obligations in the use of, processing and holding of personal data. All our staff receive annual training as part of our statutory training in September and all our schools have an audit carried out at least once a year, by the CEO as the Data Protection Officer, to ensure we are following the procedures, and also ensuring that as parents you are kept up to date on the policies and the privacy notices. GDPR can be a complicated process and so to help our pupils understand a little more about data protection, we recently had an assembly, where we looked at what data we keep in school, who has access to that data and how we keep it safe.

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Debating in History

As part of our topic on slavery Mars class have been learning about the legacies slavery left in Britain. We learned that many parts of Britain prospered due to the Atlantic slave trade and looked at lots of evidence left behind like road names, large houses and statues. We discussed whether it is still appropriate to have statues of former slave traders like Edward Colston or if they should be taken down. The children were thoroughly engaged in their debate and presented some well thought out arguments both for and against. In the end when they voted, the majority decided that it was an important piece of history and we should learn from it. I can see a few future politicians in here.



Sharing and Kindness

This week in Astronauts we have been exploring sharing and kindness alongside harvest time. We shared the story of the little red hen and worked together to make bread and enjoyed thus together at snack time.



Maths and Literacy in Mercury

In Mercury Class we have been having lots of fun in Maths learning about number bonds to 10 and 100. We explored this using numicon, looking for number patterns and using the part-whole method. In Literacy we have loved reading and learning the story – The Three Billy

Goats Gruff. We sequenced the story and then used the ideas to write our own

stories. We enjoyed acting out our stories outside.





Making Connections

The children in Jupiter are really enjoying their topic of World War Two and have found it a very good subject for linking their learning. For example, in science we are learning about diet and nutrition and the impact of rationing can be linked to this. Also in English diaries are used as a source of entertainment and information from a historical view. We have read Anne Frank's diary which is harrowing and Flossie Albright's, which is also harrowing but written in a more informal and amusing way. In maths we have thought about what we could buy for a certain amount of money- helping with their

addition and subtraction. Building links in the children's learning really helps their engagement. We are also looking forward to the educational visit on this topic.
